

PUBLIC RESTROOM

All surfaces in the restroom that may have contacted respiratory secretions, urine, or feces should be disinfected according to standard infection control procedures and disinfectant directions for use. Increase cleaning and disinfection frequency for restrooms and frequently touched surfaces in public areas when influenza activity is high.

FREQUENCY

- ▲ Minimum three times per day, with hourly touch point disinfection when frequently used.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

- ▲ Wear disposable gloves while cleaning. Discard gloves after use.
- ▲ Wash hands frequently, before and after gloving with soap and water and/or and alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

PROCEDURE

1. Carefully read and follow directions for use on the disinfectant label
2. If visibly soiled, surface must be cleaned and rinsed before disinfection. Work top to bottom.
3. Thoroughly wet surface with a registered ¹ disinfectant. Surface must remain wetted per label instructions for disinfection.
4. Wipe down frequently-touched surfaces such as light and air control switches, faucet's, toilet flush levers, door knobs, handrails with a registered disinfectant per label instructions.
5. Contact your Ecolab representative if more specific procedures are needed.
