"As a hotelier in Oklahoma I have experienced first over \$180,000 in cancellations for hotel rooms this week. At this point our fixed costs such as mortgage and interest payments will not be met. We will not be able to operate or make necessary payments as a business let alone be able sustain any payroll."

"As the Director of Sales, I am passionate about maximizing bookings and revenue so the General Manager can employ a full staff at good wages. It is true when they say "happy employees make guests happy", but the effects of the widespread panic has put our hotel and our staff on edge. While I try to strategize and find replacement booking in a smaller market, I cannot find an quick fix or the replacement business because our market demand is largely generated by OkState who is closed for what is rumored to be - the rest of the Spring semester. The virus panic has caused hoteliers alike to decrease guest services, cleaning services, and minimize select amenities in public spaces. Regardless of our nations pandemic, our guests are still our guests and they still deserve to be happy and feel like they are getting what they pay, but delivering the information to our guests can be challenging for associates. The overall effect on COVID-19 and businesses crosses over into all staff members and guests. This is the worst I have ever witnessed in 20 years of service."
