"I have experienced firsthand having to immediately lay off multiple employees. This puts them into a position of wondering how they will pay their bills and also as a business operator wondering how I will pay mine."

"We have already experienced significant decline in business revenue with increased cost to provide proper cleaning and protocols to protect our guest and co-workers. We are now facing difficult decisions on the impact on our workforce and how we can employ them in the near future."

"We are laying off 90% of our staff across our four hotels. I'm incredibly fearful that all cost cutting measures will not be enough as business has shrunk by 80% this year compared to last on average."
