## REAL ID READY | TALKING POINTS

General talking points that can be used when talking directly to U.S. travelers.

## WITHOUT THE STAR, YOU WON'T GO FAR

- ★ On October 1, 2020, if you're an American above the age of 18 and traveling by air within the U.S., whether it's for business or leisure, you will need a REAL ID-compliant driver's license or another acceptable form of ID to get through air travel security checkpoints and board your flight.
- ★ REAL ID driver's license are generally marked with a star in the upper corner of the card.
- ★ Some states (including MI, MN, NY, VT and WA) are issuing enhanced driver's licenses either instead of or in addition to REAL IDs. These are generally marked with a U.S. flag.
- ★ If you don't see a star or U.S. flag on your current driver's license, you will need to visit your state's DMV or make sure you have another form of accepted identification.
- ★ Other forms of acceptable ID include: United States passport or passport card, U.S. military ID or DHS trusted traveler cards (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST). TSA's REAL ID webpage has a full list of accepted IDs (tsa.gov/real-id).
- ★ We encourage you to check with your DMV for specific details on how to obtain a REAL ID-compliant or enhanced driver's license.
- ★ Each state requires several forms of identification and cost varies. This information is likely available on your state DMV website.
- ★ For more information, visit the TSA or DHS REAL ID websites.
- ★ Help make sure your family and friends are REAL ID ready so you don't have trouble traveling by air on or after October 1, 2020.

## **ABOUT REAL ID**

In 2005, Congress passed the REAL ID Act to set standards for the issuance of sources of identification, such as driver's licenses. On October 1, 2020 all Americans will need a REAL-ID compliant driver's license or another accepted form of identification to go through airport security.
