

Division A – Small Business Programs

Section 101. Amendments to the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL), and Emergency Grants

Small Business Administration - \$320 Billion

- Increases the authorization level for PPP from \$349 to \$649 Billion.
- Increases the appropriation level for PPP from \$349 to \$670 Billion.
- Increases the authorization level for EIDL from \$10 to \$20 Billion.
- Creates a set-aside for Insured Depository Institutions, Credit Unions, and Community Financial Institutions for the Paycheck Protection Program.
- Paycheck Protection Program to be made by the following institutions:
 - \$30 billion for loans made by Insured Depository Institutions and Credit Unions that have assets between \$10 Billion and \$50 Billion.
 - \$30 billion for loans made by Community Financial Institutions, Small Insured Depository Institutions, and Credit Unions with assets less than \$10 Billion.

Division B – Additional Emergency Appropriations for Coronavirus Response

Title 1. Public Health and Social Emergency Fund

Department of Health and Human Services - \$100 Billion

- \$75 Billion for reimbursements to hospitals and healthcare providers.
- \$25 Billion for necessary expenses to research, develop, validate, manufacture, purchase, administer, and expand capacity for COVID-19 tests
 - Divided among states, CDC, NIH BARDA, FDA, and testing costs.
- Funding for HHS Office of Inspector General for oversight

Title 2. Independent Agencies

Small Business Administration - \$60 Billion

- Appropriates an additional \$2.1 billion for the Salaries and Expenses account to remain available until September 30, 2021.
- Appropriates an additional \$50 billion for the Disaster Loans Program Account to remain available until expended.
- Appropriates an additional \$10 billion for Emergency EIDL Grants to remain available until expended.
